Modern Sexuality and Clinical Wisdom

A Day with Joseph Lichtenberg

A leading theorist and master clinician expands our understanding of sexuality in modern psychoanalytic theory, drawing on advances in infant observation, attachment theory, developmental theory, relational psychoanalysis, and his own influential theory of motivational systems. In the afternoon he will discuss questions of clinical technique using audience vignettes and cases from his *Craft and Spirit: A Guide to the Exploratory Psychotherapies*.

About the Presenter: Joseph D. Lichtenberg, MD, editor-in-chief of *Psychoanalytic Inquiry* since 1980, has been at the center of exciting developments in contemporary psychoanalysis. A collaborator and editor of Heinz Kohut, he has expanded self psychology himself through studies of infant observation and his theory of motivational systems; brought attachment theory to the center of modern psychoanalytic thinking and practice; and encouraged new ideas in relational psychoanalysis and development. His clear, user-friendly clinical writings show “great warmth, openness to examine himself, and curiosity.” (*Psychoanalytic Quarterly*) He founded the Institute of Contemporary Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis in Washington, D.C and served as president of the International Council of Psychoanalytic Self Psychology. He maintains a full private practice in Washington and Bethesda. His latest book, *Sensuality and Sexuality Across the Divide of Shame*, is scheduled for release this fall.
